Members of the Committee,

EIPCa **supports AB 1077** as written and amended as of the date of this letter.

The U.S. Constitution and the California Constitution both mandate that voters for federal and state offices be bona fide citizens of the United States.

It is incumbent upon the state government to ensure that access to ballots be limited to eligible voters.

Since California now automatically mails a ballot to **every person** on the voter rolls, it has an obligation to ensure those rolls be free of ineligible registrants.

The most recent permutation of the California Motor Voter law now virtually mandates that personal information of anyone engaging with state or federal agencies for any reason be automatically uploaded to the Secretary of State for the purpose of voter registration.

That includes individuals who have provided those agencies with documentation of their non-U.S. citizen status.

Under current California law, those agencies, the ones with definitive information as to those individuals' eligibility to vote (or lack thereof), are currently forbidden to provide that evidence to the SOS or other registration or research entity.

AB 1077 would resolve that counter-intuitive, completely counterproductive and nonsensical situation by forbidding those agencies from uploading for voter registration those individuals whose paperwork disqualifies them from eligibility.

EIPCa urges the Committee to protect legal citizens' right to self-governance and to fulfill its obligation to uphold the Constitutions they have taken an oath to serve by bringing AB 1077 up for a vote, and affirming it with a unanimous YES vote.
